School Nursing & Looked After Children's Services

Dear Parent/Guardian,

The school nursing service within your local area can provide health education, promotion, advice and support for all children, young people and their families. As your child is School aged, we wanted to take this opportunity to inform you of the services that we deliver in schools.

At school entry age, a 'School Entry Review' process is undertaken and provides an assessment of children's health needs.

The school entry review for 4-5yr old consists of:

- Transfer of care from Health Visiting to School Nursing
- Vision screening
- Measurement of growth (height and weight)
- Hearing screening (undertaken by the audiology department)
- Review of children's immunisation status.

Your child can access these services as follows:

Vision screening

We recommend that you take your child to an optometrist (opticians) to have their eyes tested.

Why is it important to book a sight test?

Good vision is essential to ensure children have the opportunity to achieve their full visual, educational and social potential. Children may not realise they have a vision problem, which, in turn, may affect their development and education.

It is therefore advised that you book a sight test for your child, when it is convenient, to ensure that any issues can be picked up at the earliest opportunity.

All NHS sight tests are FREE of charge for children under the age of 16 and those aged 16 to 18 in full-time education.
