Datganiad GAD Ysgol Gynradd Gymraeg Gellionnen

Dyrennir y Grant Amddifadedd Disgyblion (GAD) i ysgolion â disgyblion sy'n dod o deuluoedd incwm isel ac y gwyddys eu bod ar hyn o bryd yn gymwys am brydau ysgol am ddim a disgyblion sydd wedi bod yn derbyn gofal yn barhaus am fwy na chwe mis (PDG).

Disgwylir i ysgolion wneud y defnydd gorau o'r cyllid hwn i roi strategaethau cynaliadwy ar waith a fydd yn cyflwyno newidiadau'n gyflym i ddysgwyr sy'n gymwys am brydau ysgol am ddim neu sy'n PDG.

Fel ysgol, rydym wedi cytuno ar y camau canlynol:

1. nodi'r grŵp targed o ddisgyblion, eu nodweddion a'u hanghenion
2. cynllunio ymyriadau sy'n gwneud y defnydd mwyaf effeithiol o adnoddau
3. monitro a gwerthuso effaith adnoddau

Yn 2016-17, rhoddwyd dyraniad GAD £25,100 i Ysgol Gynradd Gymraeg Gellionnen.

Yn Ysgol Gynradd Gymraeg Gellionnen mae gennym gynllun cynhwysfawr, y mae Awdurdod Lleol Abertawe ac ERW wedi cytuno arno ac yn ei fonitro i hyrwyddo cynnydd a dileu rhwystrau i ddysgu i fyfyrwyr sy'n gymwys am y cyllid hwn.

Rydym wedi defnyddio'r cyllid sydd ar gael i:

- gwella dysgu ac addysgu trwy ddarparu rhaglenni cefnogi
- darparu rhaglenni ymyrryd a chefnogi y mae wedi'i brofi eu bod yn cael yr effaith fwyaf a'u bod yn gynaliadwy - Dyfal Donc (Rhifedd a Darllen), Cynllun Chwarae Cadarnhaol Sir Derby a Tric a Chlic.
- darparu hyfforddiant o safon i staff , gan gynnwys hyfforddiant Tric a Chlic a Cynllun Chwarae Cadarnhaol Sir Derby.
- rhoi systemau olrhain data ar waith a'u defnyddio i nodi anghenion dysgwyr, targedu ymyriadau a monitro effaith e.e. trwy proffil Boxhall, systemau tracio mewnol ag INCERTs,
- gweithio mewn partneriaeth ag ysgolion eraill, y gymuned a sefydliadau eraill -Ysgol Gyfun Bryntawe ag ysgolion clwstwr,
- datblygu gallu arweinyddiaeth i flaenoriaethu'r effaith ar ansawdd darpariaeth a deilliannau.

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School PDG Statement

The Pupil Deprivation Grant (PDG) is allocated to schools with pupils who come from low-income families and are currently known to be eligible for free school meals (FSM) and pupils who have been looked after continuously for more than six months (LAC).

Schools are expected to make the best use of this funding to implement sustainable strategies that will quickly bring about changes for learners eligible for free school meals or who are LAC.

As a school we have agreed the following three steps:

4. to identify the target group of pupils, its characteristics and needs
5. to plan interventions which make the most effective use of resources
6. to monitor and evaluate the impact of resources

In 2016-17 Ysgol Gynradd Gymraeg Gellionnen School was provided with a PDG allocation of £25,100.00

At Ysgol Gynradd Gymraeg Gellionnen School we have a comprehensive plan, agreed and monitored by Swansea Local Authority and ERW, to promote progress and remove barriers to learning for students eligible for this funding.

We have used the funding available to:

- provide intervention and support programmes that are proven to have the greatest impact and to be sustainable- Dyfal Donc (Rhifedd a Darllen) , Derbyshire Positive Play Scheme and Tric a Chlic.
- provide specific high quality training for school staff, including Derbyshire Positive Play Project and Tric a Chlic.
- implement and use data tracking systems to identify learners' needs, target interventions and monitor impact e.g through Boxhall profile. Internal tracking systems and INCERTS.
- work in partnership with other schools, the community and other organisations- *YGG Bryntawe and cluster schools*,
- developed leadership capacity to prioritise the impact on the quality of provision and outcomes
